What is a Cartel?

- Collusion between businesses to restrict competition in the market.
- Arrangements or agreements to fix prices, allocate markets, limit production or supply, and rig bids.



Independent Consumer and Competition Commission Act 2002

- Provisions under the ICCC Act that deal with Cartels:
- Section 50: Contracts, arrangements, or understandings substantially lessening competition
- Section 51: Covenants substantially lessening competition prohibited
- Section 52: Contracts, arrangements, or understandings containing exclusionary provisions
 are prohibited
- Section 53: Certain provision of contracts, etc., with respect to prices are deemed to substantially lessen competition
- Section 63: Preventing the supply of goods or services

Penalties

- The types of penalties for Cartel conduct under the ICCC Act:
- Pecuniary Penalties
- Damages
- General Penalties
- Offences by Corporations
